

Rules and regulations for medical students (Vth year, 2010)

The course of pediatrics comprises seminars and clinical training on ward and a final exam (practical and a theoretical test).

A. Daily schedule:

8¹⁵ - 11¹⁵ TRAINING ON WARD - MORNING GROUP
11³⁰ - 13⁰⁰ SEMINAR
13¹⁵ - 16¹⁵ TRAINING ON WARD - AFTERNOON GROUP

Daily schedule for students attending clinical training on Nephrology Ward Children's Hospital at the Św. Wojciecha street:

8⁰⁰ - 11⁰⁰ TRAINING ON WARD - MORNING GROUP
11³⁰ - 13⁰⁰ SEMINAR
13³⁰ - 16³⁰ TRAINING ON WARD - AFTERNOON GROUP

B. Seminars and clinical training on ward:

1. All training activities are obligatory and the presence is registered.
2. The scope of knowledge required for each seminar and on ward training is given on the bulletin board. Student is expected to read the appropriate passages from textbooks. Student's comprehension of material will be checked every day. In case of insufficient knowledge in order to obtain credit a student has to make an appointment with a lecturer (or assistant) on last two days of the course to demonstrate comprehension of the subject in question.
3. Every absence must be justified and notified before the end of the course. In case of a justified absence student has to learn the material discussed during the missed seminar and student's comprehension of the material has to be checked before the end of the course. It is a student's responsibility to make an appointment with a lecturer or assistant.
4. At the end of the course student has to pass a one-choice test. Test questions are based on recommended textbooks and on subjects taught during seminars.
5. In order to be eligible for a test student has to obtain credits from all seminars and on ward training proceeding it.
6. A failed test can be resubmitted twice: first attempt one week later and second attempt in June 2010.
7. Unjustified absence during any test is regarded as a failed test.
8. An official note giving the reasons of an absence during any test should be delivered during one week after the date of a test. Failure to do so will be treated as an unjustified absence.

C. Final exam.

1. To be eligible for the final examination a student is expected to obtain the credit from the course of pediatrics.
2. The final exam consists of the practical part (one has to perform physical examination of a child and to make a differential diagnosis) and the theory – one-choice test exam. Should you have any questions or problems please contact dr hab. med. Tomasz Urański or dr med. Małgorzata Mokrzycka
