Rules and regulations for students (IVth year, Faculty of Dentistry, 2009/2010)

The course of pediatrics comprises seminars and clinical training on ward as well as the final exam (a theoretical test).

Seminars: Monday 8.00 - 9.30
On ward training: Wednesday 11.15 - 12.45

Both seminars and classes take place at the Dept. of Pediatrics, Hematology and Oncology (St. Nicolas Building), ul. Unii Lubelskiej 1

Seminars and clinical training on ward:

1. All training activities are obligatory and the presence is registered.
2. During on ward training students are kindly requested to wear a doctor's coat as well as hospital shoes. Students are strongly advised to have their own stethoscopes.
3. The scope of knowledge required for each seminar and on ward training is given on the bulletin board. Student is expected to read the appropriate passages from textbooks. Student's comprehension of material will be checked every day. In case of insufficient knowledge in order to obtain credit a student has to make an appointment with a lecturer (or assistant) on last two days of the course to demonstrate comprehension of the subject in question.
3. Every absence must be justified and notified before the end of the course. In case of a justified absence student has to learn the material discussed during the missed seminar and student's comprehension of the material has to be checked before the end of the course. It is a student's responsibility to make an appointment with a lecturer or assistant. Missed classes should also be compensated.
4. At the end of the course student has to obtain a final credit. A credit is given on basis of student's comprehension of the material taught during seminars and on ward trainings, evaluated by a teacher in verbal form.
6. A failed credit can be resubmitted twice: first attempt one week later and second attempt in June 2010.

Final exam.

1. To be eligible for the final examination a student is expected to obtain the final credit from the course of pediatrics.
2. The final exam consists of the single choice test, comprising 60 questions to be solved within 60 min. A minimal positive result is 36 of 60 questions.
