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Erasmus+ Programme

ERASMUS+ is the European Union program for education, training, youth and sport. It is the result of a combination of European programs implemented by the European Commission. Currently, the Erasmus + program has been extended for the years 2021-2027.

Countries participating in the Erasmus + program:



Denmark, Finland, Ireland, Iceland, Lichtenstein, Luxembourg, Norway, Sweden, Great Britain, Austria, Belgium, Cyprus, France, Greece, Spain, Netherlands, Malta, Germany, Portugal, Italy, Bulgaria, Croatia, Czech Republic, Estonia, Macedonia North, Lithuania, Latvia, Romania, Serbia, Slovakia, Slovenia, Turkey, Hungary.

Student exchange under the Erasmus program and its successor Erasmus+ has been organized in Europe for 30 years. The success of the program prompted the European Commission to propose its new edition in the years 2021–2027.

To participate in the Erasmus + program, universities are eligible for the Erasmus Charter for Higher Education, awarded by the European Commission. It is a type of certificate that allows universities to apply for funding for specific activities included in the program. All universities intending to take part in the Erasmus+ program are required to submit an application to the European Commission. The card is issued for a multi-year period. In January 2014, the Pomeranian Medical University was awarded Erasmus Charter for Higher Education (ECHE) for the years 2014-2020, we have now received a new ECHE card for the

years 2021-2027. With a dedicated budget of more than EUR 26 billion, the new Erasmus+ program will not only be more inclusive and international, but also more digital and greener.

General Rules

In the Erasmus + program, you can apply for mobility:

- **for studies** - to a foreign university with which the home university has a signed agreement (Partner University),
- **for traineeship during studies** - to a foreign academic or non-academic institution. You can use the offer of your home university or find a place by yourself (you must obtain the institution's initial approval within the required time),
- **for traineeship after graduation (graduate)** - to a foreign academic or non-academic institution. You can use the offer of your home university or find a place by yourself (you must obtain the institution's initial approval letter within the required time).

You can go for studies and traineeships (during and after studies) under the ERASMUS + Program several times, provided that the total length of stay abroad will be:

- **max 12 months within one study cycle;**
- **max. 24 months on master's studies;**

In the Erasmus + program, each person gets the possibility of mobility no more than 12 months in each degree, and 24 months in the case of master's studies. This is called "mobility capital".



Who can participant in Erasmus + program?

A programme participant must meet the following conditions:

- be a student, doctoral student or graduate of PUM,
- be a citizen of a country participating in the programme or have a permanent residence or refugee status in Poland,
- not to be on Dean's leave during the study or traineeship,
- in the case of study abroad - to have completed the second year of a uniform Master's degree programme, or the first year in the case of other studies, no later than on the day of departure,
- to have sufficient command of the foreign language to be able to study at a partner university or to take part in a traineeship at a receiving institution.
- the mobility capital referred to in subsection 3 has not been used up.

Note: It is forbidden to stay (during the Erasmus + program) on dean's leave. You can't leave without having completed the previous year of study.

On which Universities can I apply ?

The exchange of students in the Erasmus + program may be conducted by universities with an Erasmus Charter for Higher Education **that have signed an exchange agreement under this program.** It must be a university located in a country participating in the Erasmus + program. Part of the studies may be completed only at a faculty which provides education in the same field or possibly in a related field.

Note: The list of PUM Partner Universities is at the end of the Guide.

Where can you go for a traineeship during your studies and after?

- For an traineeship, you can go to university, to a hospital or a foreign institution that has agreed to accept a student / graduate for an traineeship under the Erasmus + Higher Education program. It could be: higher education institutions with an ECHE card, non-profit non-profit organizations, associations, non-governmental organizations,
- public or private organizations in the field of education, training and youth, public or private enterprise, public authority at local, regional or national level, research institute, foundation, hospital.

Before arrival, the host institution must first give it's initial approval and state the language level with which they will accept the student. After that, you must sign the "Learning Agreement for Traineeships" document. The student who is on the placement is obliged to send a monthly report confirming the placement. The host institution for the placement must be located in a country participating in the Erasmus + program.

The traineeship may last at least 2 months, maximum 12 months.

For how long can you go for a study mobility?

For a period from three months to one academic year. A university should send students for a period that is a closed part of the study program that is easy to complete, for example, one semester or academic year.

A stay under the Erasmus + program cannot exceed one - the same - academic year, a scholarship that started in the summer semester of one academic year, cannot be continued in the winter semester of the following year.

The exact date of commencement of studies at the partner foreign university depends primarily on when classes begin in the winter and summer semesters, as well as on individual learning arrangements between the student, the sending and receiving university.



The mobility funding granted under the Program is intended to cover part of the costs related to the mobility. The amount of the grant does not compensate for the full cost of travel and living abroad. During the mobility, the participant may also need to involve his own funds.

The period of financing the mobility of studies is a maximum of 5 months for semester stays and a maximum of 9 months for two-semester stays. It is also allowed to travel without funding, from the so-called co-financing with zero.

Note: If a student / doctoral student is obliged to pay tuition fees at the University, student is also obliged to continue these fees during the mobility under the Program.

For how long can you go for an traineeship mobility?

For a period of 2 to 12 months, within one and the same academic year. At our university, traineeships during studies take place during the summer holidays, because the duration of the traineeship cannot conflict with the period in which classes at our university are held.

In the Erasmus + program, graduates (bachelors, masters and doctors) may also go abroad for traineeships - within one year of graduation. The length of stay abroad is included in the total duration of mobility at the level of study at which the student was qualified for the mobility. Recruitment takes place during the final year of study.

NOTE: It is possible to combine a study mobility with an traineeship in one academic year, but their duration cannot overlap.

What is ECTS?

ECTS (European Credit Transfer and Accumulation System) is a system that facilitates the completion of the period of studies completed by a student at a foreign university by his home university. The ECTS system was developed in the second half of the 1980s as part of the then Erasmus Program. Since then, the ECTS system has been implemented by an increasing number

of classes) in the ECTS system, a full academic year corresponds to 60 credits, a semester - 30 credits, and a trimester - 20 credits;

- developing a Catalog of Subjects presenting a detailed description of the classes offered by the university within individual fields of study with the given number of ECTS points for each subject;



of European universities, and the widest application of the system is observed in universities participating in the exchange of Erasmus + students. The ECTS system is a code of best practice for the recognition of (period of) studies. Its basis is the transparency of the study program and the principles of completing classes. Recognition of the period of study is one of the basic conditions for mobility under the Erasmus + program.

The ECTS system guarantees the transparency of completing study periods thanks to:

- use of ECTS credits assigned to subjects (cycle of classes); the basis for assigning points is the workload required from the student to obtain a credit in a given course (cycle

- using the Learning Agreement for Studies prepared before the student begins the period of study abroad and specifying the student learning agreement and the number of ECTS credits that will be awarded for completing them; the agreement is binding on all three parties who are required to sign it: the home university, the host university and the student (this document often has to be accompanied by a "Transcript of Records" describing the student's academic achievements to date at his home university);

- the use of the Transcript of Records, which lists all the subjects (cycles) completed by the student abroad and the corresponding number of ECTS credits. The transcript of records is issued by the host university.

Note: Before departure, each subject and its ECTS are checked by the Faculty Coordinator.

The coordinator may enter subjects to be completed in the same year at our university (e.g. during the semester break) or after returning for the next year.

Recruitment procedure

Before submitting the application, you should read the curriculum offered at the selected partner university and consult WITH the relevant Departmental Coordinator whether it is possible to prepare a Curriculum agreement.

The application for study consists of:

- a completed **application form** indicating the first-choice university and the second-choice university,
- **confirmation of knowledge of the foreign language** in which classes will be conducted abroad at the level required by the selected partner university, as specified in the inter-institutional agreement,
- **additional documentation (if applicable):**
 - documentation that forms the basis for awarding additional points for demonstrated scholarly achievement
 - disability certificate.

The documents referred to above should be delivered as originals, i.e. on paper, or in a form provided with a qualified electronic signature or 'trusted signature' (ePUAP). However, during the period of limited operation of PUM, as well as during periods indicated in a separate order of the Rector, it is permissible to deliver documents in the form of scans.

Applications for a planned traineeship after graduation must be submitted in the final year of study. An application consists of:

- a **completed application form**
- **confirmation of acceptance for the traineeship** by the selected receiving institution, including information on the initial dates and the language of the traineeship,
- **certification of proficiency in the foreign language** to be taught abroad at the level required by the selected receiving institution,
- **additional documentation (if applicable):**
 - documentation that forms the basis for awarding additional points for demonstrated scholarly achievement
 - disability certificate.

The documents referred to above should be delivered as originals, i.e. on paper, or in a form provided with a qualified electronic signature or a 'trusted signature' (ePUAP). However, during the period of limited operation of PUM, as well as during periods indicated in a separate order of the Rector, it is permissible to deliver documents in the form of scans.

Recruitment qualification

University Commission awards points to qualified persons according to the following rules:

- the grade point average referred to in item 7, multiplied by 2, (e.g. average of: $4.25 \times 2 = 8.50$ points),

Recruitment

Student enrollment for studies:

1. submission of applications and required documents - March
2. foreign language exams - April/May
3. Qualification Committee - May
4. announcement of the results of the qualification procedure - May
5. organizational meeting with students qualified for foreign studies - June
6. submission of documents necessary for the implementation of studies abroad - depending on the dates of the Partner Universities.

Schedule of recruiting students/graduates for traineeships during and after studies:

1. submission of applications and required documents March
2. foreign language exams April
3. Qualification Committee May
4. announcement of the results of the qualification procedure May
5. organizational meeting with students qualified - beginning of June,



- 1 point for having academic achievements during the current study cycle and at the latest by the last day of the deadline set by PUM for the submission of applications, in the form of:
 - publication of a scientific article (individually or as a collective work) in a peer-reviewed journal with IF, MNiSW scores, or in a peer-reviewed journal without IF or with MNiSW scores; the actual date of publication in the journal reported to the PUM Library (and not the date of acceptance for publication) is considered as publication of the work,
 - active participation in a national or international congress / conference / symposium / congress / science Olympiad / scientific competition symposium of student organizations, medical universities, STN or scientific societies / proved by: poster, abstract, award, honorable mention, etc.,
 - obtaining a domestic or foreign research grant funded by external sources,
 - winning a national or international award for scholarly achievement;
- 0.75 points for the opportunity to deepen foreign language skills during the traineeship abroad,
- 0.75 point for the opportunity to learn a new culture and customs of the country where the receiving institution chosen by the candidate is located.

A person who is a citizen of a country eligible for the Programme is entitled to go to an institution in their home country, however, in the recruitment process the points indicated in item 14 points c and d are not taken into account. However, if the language of study is their mother tongue, the points indicated in item 14 point c will not be taken into account.

Results

University Commission, on the basis of the awarded points and the limits of places in a given field of study at partner universi-

ties in selected countries, establishes a list of persons qualified for the Programme, consisting of a core list and a standby list. The person with the highest number of points has priority in choosing a university in a given country.

- The core list is a list of persons whose study will be subsidized. In a case when the limit of places in a given field of study at a chosen partner university is used up by persons with higher number of points, a person from the core list may change the choice of partner university within the same country.
- The standby list is a list of persons whose studies abroad may be financed if there are available funds remaining and provided that a place is available in a given field of study at a selected partner university or in a selected country.

Language exams

Exams take place at SPNJO. The examiner checks such skills as listening comprehension, speaking and reading. The issues for the exam can be found in the information about the 2021 recruitment.

A person who meets one of the following conditions may be exempted from submitting proof of language proficiency in the application form:

- over the last 5 years of study (including the current year) has completed or is completing a study or traineeship under the Programme in the language required by the selected partner university and has obtained certification of language proficiency at the required level in a previous classification or as a result of the first or second language proficiency test in the OLS system,
- is a student in an English-speaking program and plans to go to a partner university where classes are conducted in English,
- the language required by the selected partner university is their native language.

After being nominated to the Partner University, the student receive:

- Certificate of the status of an Erasmus + student
- Certificate to the National Health Fund for an EHIC card.
- Certificate of a passed language exam confirming the knowledge of the language at the level required by the Partner University.

What documents must be sign before going on an Erasmus+ mobility?

Before leaving, the scholarship holder must sign at the university two basic documents applicable in the Erasmus + program:

- **Learning Agreement for Traineeships or**
- **an agreement regarding the mobility and granting a grant (Grant Agreement).**

The Learning Agreement for Studies is an agreement between the student, the host institution and the home institution that specifies the curriculum for the student to attend at the host institution and the number of ECTS credits for each subject.

The agreement contains a list of subjects that must be completed at the foreign university so that the home university can recognize and complete the period of studies.

On the part of the university / faculty, this document should be signed by a person authorized to make decisions regarding credits (in the case of PUM, this document is signed by the Faculty Coordinator and the Vice-Dean). The agreement must be signed by all parties before the student's departure. It is recommended that you take a copy of the document with you.

The Learning Agreement for Traineeships is an agreement between the student, the host institution and the home university that defines the program and course of the placement. The agreement will be the basis for recognition and completion of the traineeship by the home department. The agreement must be signed by all three parties before the student's departure. It is recommended that you take a copy of the document with you. Full implementation of the agreed traineeship program should guarantee its automatic credit by the home university. The student is obliged to submit a report on the traineeship every month and a final report

Agreement with the university regarding the departure and payment of the **"GRANT AGREEMENT"** scholarship: in addition to the Agreement, an agreement should be signed with the home university, which specifies in detail the conditions of departure and the payment and settlement of the scholarship (including the duration of stay at the host university / institution the host, the amount of the scholarship, the method of its payment, the deadline for settling accounts with the home university, etc.).

Each university has the right to create its own contract text based on the guidelines of the National Agency and the text of the sample contract. The contract must contain certain nec-

essary elements resulting from the principles of the Erasmus + Higher Education program. The agreement can be signed if the home university receives a Learning Agreement for Studies or Learning Agreement for Traineeships confirmed by the host university / institution.

In addition to signing the above-mentioned documents should also be filled in the application form of the host university (usually the application form and accomodation form) or CV in the case of an traineeship. A foreign university may also ask for a Transcript of Records to be sent before going to study or traineeship to check the level that the student represents.

NOTE: Each foreign university has a deadline for sending documents (the deadline set by our university is a contractual deadline). Failure to meet the deadline may result in denial of admission to studies.



"During the mobility" are the changes during studies in Learning Agreement for Studies or Learning Agreement for Traineeships. Changes to the agreement can be made after the arrival at the partner university / host institution, provided that all parties accept them and that they are introduced in writing within 5 weeks of arrival. Full implementation of the agreed study / traineeship program should guarantee automatic crediting of studies / traineeships by the home university. In the event of problems with the availability of items during the mobility, you should immediately contact the Coordinator.

Note: The Erasmus + grant in a fixed amount may be transferred to the indicated PLN or currency account only after signing the financial agreement.

Online Linguistic Support

One of Erasmus+ programme strategic objectives is to strengthen linguistic skills and support language learning. The Online Linguistic Support (OLS) supports language learning for Erasmus+ mobility participants.

The OLS offers participants in Erasmus+ long-term mobility activities the opportunity to assess their skills in the foreign lan-



guage(s) they will use during mobility for studies or mobility for traineeships.

In addition, selected participants may follow an online language course to improve their competence.

Note: The license for the course is granted only after signing the "grant agreement". The course is granted for the entire period of student mobility.

Insurance

Mobility for studies grant agreement provisions regarding insurance

The participant shall have adequate insurance coverage, in accordance with national regulations of the country where the receiving institution is located:

- The participant acknowledges that he/she has been informed by the sending institution of the obligation to basic have health insurance coverage and accident insurance coverage.
- The participant is responsible for concluding mandatory health insurance and accident insurance policy.
- The participant represents that he/she has been informed by the sending institution of the fact that it is covered by liability insurance related to statutory activity conducted by the institution. The participant further declares that he/she is fully aware that the aforementioned policy does not protect him/her fully during the studies at the receiving institution.

- The participant represents that he/she has been made aware of the obligation to take complementary insurance coverage policy in the scope specified by the receiving institution.

Confirmation of the health insurance coverage constitutes an Annex to this agreement. Moreover, the participant acknowledges that:

- He/she is aware of the issues relating to health insurance in the receiving country.
- He/she holds mandatory health insurance, i.e. European Health Insurance Card (referred to further on as „EHIC”), and knows well that he/she is obliged to take this insurance or otherwise, shall bear any negative consequences of the lack thereof.
- He/she has been made aware of the obligation to get informed whether EHIC will provide sufficient health coverage in the receiving country, and whether there exists an obligation to take complementary private health insurance. In such case, it is the participant’s duty to conclude complementary health insurance policy, or otherwise, he/she shall bear any negative consequences of the lack thereof.

For studies the participant is obliged to have complementary liability insurance that provides coverage in the receiving country for damages caused by the participant resulting from his/her performance of tasks expected of the participant during the studies. The conclusion of such policy is the obligation of the participant or otherwise, he/she shall bear any legal consequences of the lack thereof. The participant may be released from the obligation to take complementary liability coverage only if the receiving institution assumes this obligation.

For studies the participant is obliged to be covered with personal accident insurance for the length of stay in the receiving country. The policy should cover all tasks performed by the participant in the study place during the course of studies, covering at least damages incurred by the participant in the study place. Moreover, the participant shall check whether according to national regulations of the receiving country it is compulsory or just recommended to conclude complementary accident insurance with a freely selected insurance company, with a scope of coverage that goes beyond damages incurred by the participant in the study place during the course of studies. The conclusion of the aforementioned insurance policy is the obligation of the participant or otherwise, he/she shall bear legal consequences of the lack thereof.

The participant holding Polish citizenship shall register in „Odyssey”, an online security platform for Poles travelling abroad, kept by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs.

Mobility for traineeships grant agreement provisions regarding insurance

The participant shall have adequate insurance coverage, in accordance with the regulations in place in the country where the receiving organization is located:

- The participant acknowledges that he/she has been informed by the sending institution of the obligation to pos-



sess basic health insurance and accident insurance coverage.

- The participant is responsible for concluding mandatory health insurance and accident insurance policy.
- The participant represents that he/she has been informed by the sending institution of the fact that it is covered by liability insurance (TPL) related to statutory activity conducted by the institution. The participant further declares that he/she is fully aware that the aforementioned policy does not protect him/her fully during the traineeship at the receiving institution.
- The participant represents that he/she has been made aware of the obligation to conclude complementary insurance policy in the scope specified by the receiving institution.

Confirmation of the health insurance coverage constitutes an Annex to this agreement. Moreover, the participant acknowledges that:

He/she is aware of the issues relating to health insurance in the receiving country.

He/she holds mandatory health insurance, i.e. European Health Insurance Card (referred to further on as „EHIC”), and knows well that he/she is obliged to take this insurance or otherwise, shall bear any negative consequences of the lack thereof.

He/she has been made aware of the obligation to get informed whether EHIC will provide sufficient health coverage in the receiving country, and whether there exists an obligation to take complementary private health insurance. In such case, it is the participant’s duty to take complementary health insurance pol-

icy or otherwise, he/she shall bear any negative consequences of the lack thereof.

For traineeships the participant is obliged to have complementary liability insurance that provides coverage in the trainee’s workplace, including damages caused by the participant relating to the tasks performed in the course of traineeship. The scope of liability insurance coverage will be agreed upon by three parties, that is the participant, sending institution and receiving institution under the trilateral “Traineeship Programme Agreement”. The participant may be released from the obligation to take complementary liability coverage only if the receiving institution assumes this obligation, which shall be clearly stated in the trilateral “Traineeship Programme Agreement”.

The participant shall be covered with personal accident insurance:

- with regard to the tasks performed by the participant during the course of traineeship in the place of traineeship, covering at least damages incurred by the participant in the place of traineeship and relating from accidents at work.
- The scope of accident insurance coverage has been agreed upon by three parties, that is the participant, sending institution and receiving institution under the trilateral “Traineeship Programme Agreement”.
- The participant shall get informed whether in the receiving country it is compulsory to conclude complementary accident insurance with a scope of coverage that goes beyond damages incurred by the participant during the course of traineeship in the place of traineeship. It is the participant’s duty to conclude complementary accident insurance policy, or otherwise, he/she shall bear any negative consequences of the lack thereof.

- 5.5. The participant holding Polish citizenship shall register in „Odysseusz”, an online security platform for Poles traveling abroad, kept by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs.

Additional information on insurance for graduates carrying out mobility for traineeships

All graduates planning to carry out mobility for traineeships should get acquainted with their national provisions regarding **European Health Insurance Card** which apply to graduates.



Grant

Erasmus + scholarship is only a contribution to the costs of traveling and staying abroad. The student allocates the received funds to cover part of the costs of accommodation, subsistence and other expenses related to a stay in another country. Rates are change each year and depend on the country of departure.

The monthly scholarship rates are fixed per country. The final amount for the entire mobility period is determined by multiplying the number of days / months by the applicable daily / monthly rate for the host country. In the case of incomplete months, the grant amount is calculated by multiplying the number of days in the incomplete month by 1/30 of this amount.

The rules for calculating the general pool of funds that a university receives for the payment of scholarships for students result from the annually approved rules for the awarding and use of funds for activities related to mobility.

Based on these rules, the university determines the method of distributing the received funds among all scholarship holders.

In accordance with the principle adopted at PUM, the scholarship for studies is paid in THREE installments (1st installment - 70% before departure, 2nd installment during the 2nd semester of studies 20%, 3rd installment after returning 10%, and the traineeship scholarship is paid in 2 installments - 90% of the total amount before departure 10% after returning. **You can also apply for additional funding from the Erasmus + program Higher education for people with disabilities and an allowance for receiving a OP KED social scholarship.**

Grant Information for students with fewer opportunity

Students and graduates who will view the criteria in the favorite “people with fewer opportunities” (students and graduates with fewer opportunities) more plus an amount of 250 € for each month of stay in the destination from the departure category.

The decision of the university to grant a social scholarship or a group of students who meet the criteria specified in the rector's ordinance. For graduates - decisions made during the last year of studies will be taken into account.

Green Travel

Green travel - travel using low-emission means of transport such as bus, train or shared support from a car.

In the case of working in the title of “green travel”, students and graduates are entitled to receive individual support for the cost of living for up to 4 additional days.

Students and graduates not receiving the standard lump sum for travel expenses are entitled to receive € 50 in terms of green travel deadlines.

Accommodation

Information about the procedures in force at a given university can be found in information packages or other materials. They are also very often sent to the student after submitting the application form. The receiving university usually provides incoming students with accommodation in dormitories or helps to find private accommodation. Some universities, however, do not have their own dormitories, then you have to find accommodation individually. In some cases, you have to pay a deposit which is returned at the end of your stay. Often, there are separate forms for applying for accommodation (next to the application forms) that must be sent in a timely manner to the place indicated.

NOTE: Not all host universities / institutions provide dormitories.

Shortening the study period

The student is obliged to study abroad within the time limit specified in the contract signed before going on a scholarship. The consequence of shortening the study period is the necessity to return part of the scholarship. The minimum period of study is 3 full months (without any rounds). A stay shorter than 3 months requires the entire grant to be returned and the PUM will not recognize the period of stay abroad. The only exception are cases of random events (after approval by the National Agency of the Erasmus + Program). If it is necessary to shorten the period of study, you should immediately contact the Erasmus + Program Office (before leaving the partner university).

Co-financing is settled with accuracy to one day. Shortening the stay (as long as it does not lead to the mobility being considered unauthorized, as mentioned above) means the necessity to return the unused part of the grant.

Extension of the study period

The stay abroad can be extended by another semester, but only from the winter semester to the summer semester. The stay from the summer semester to the winter semester cannot be extended, as it is already the new academic year. The principle of the program is that the stay abroad under ERASMUS + cannot exceed a given academic year. Student in that situation will sign an annex to the first grant agreement.

Recognition

Recognition/Credits for the period of studies completed at the host university are made by the dean / head of doctoral studies / director of the Doctoral School, on the basis of:

- Learning Agreement,**
- Transcript of records obtained from the host university,**
- A certificate confirming the dates of stay.**

If the ECTS points obtained by the student / doctoral student at the host university are lower than those established in the agreement on the study program, the Dean / Head of Doctoral Studies / Director of the Doctoral School may oblige the student / doctoral student to supplement the differences, specifying the conditions for such supplementation.

Note:

The student is also obliged to complete the 2nd questionnaire after departure, which will be sent to him by e-mail.
