Module objectives		The objective of the module Palliative medicine/care in dentistry - psycho-social aspects is: 1) Preparing the student to recognise and deal with psychological and sociological problems concerning advanced illness 2) Familiarising the student with the ways of using strengths of family members to build a plan of coping with a loved one's illness. 3) Providing the student with the knowledge and practical skills necessary to interact with patients with a diagnosis of cancer (and other terminal illnesses) and their families. 4) Introducing the practices of using communication to better adapt to the situation of illness and treatment in the patient. 5) Familiarising with the use of hope in treatment, recovery and health maintenance.
