§1

Teaching Methods

1. Clinical Allergology Course (seminars 15h, classes 16h) is run on the fourth year in the system of a block of classes which is compatible with the current curriculum, in the chair; from 8.00 - 15.00
2. Students take classes in subgroups, according to PUM study regulations. The subgroups shall be set by the Department of Clinical Allergology (based on the list provided by the Dean's Office) and cannot be changed. Attendance is mandatory.

§2

Mode and forms of compensation of missed activities

1. Making up an excused absence (concerns 1 day of classes), requires a written compilation of an issue indicated by the teaching assistant professor from the Department
2. The form of making up the absence during the classes is determined in each case individually by the lecturer of the Department of Clinical Allergology PUM (Iwona Poziomkowska-Gęsicka, MD PhD) within a period not exceeding two weeks from the date of cessation of absence.

§3

Requirements for course completion in order to sit the credit of exam

1. To get a credit is the presence during all the seminars and classes. In documented cases of random situations (see study regulations PUM), one-day absence does not exclude the

possibility to take a test. In any other situation, it is necessary to retake classes of the appropriate number of days and to take a test with a different group.

§4

Principles of attending classes during the academic year*

1. Students take an active part in classes. Students must have their own protective clothing (clean and ironed lab coat) and a stethoscope. Students are treated by the patients as doctors. For this reason, all the associated rules should be followed. This also applies to compliance with medical confidentiality.
2. During classes, the student is obliged to deepen their knowledge in the field of discussed subjects in subsequent seminars. The Assistant's statement concerning a significant lack of knowledge related to the very field may be the basis for a decision to take another written test covering both theoretical background as well as practical skills that are included in the content of the curriculum in allergology.
3. The student will not be admitted to the classes in the following cases:
 - a) being late for classes exceeding 20 minutes;
 - b) lack of the necessary dress. It is obligatory to have: changeable footwear (regardless of the weather or season) or special hospital footwear covers, a clean laboratory coat and your own mask and gloves. Students are treated like doctors by the patients. For this reason, the related rules must be followed. This also applies to the observance of medical confidentiality.
 - c) the student will not be admitted to the classes or will be expelled from them in the event of improper behavior contrary to the study regulations or other regulations in force at the University / Hospital / Clinic, behavior disrupting the conduct of classes, threatening health, life or property, and also in the event of gross lack of personal culture in relation to the teacher or other people participating in the classes.
4. Not admitting to the classes or being excluded from them in the cases mentioned above is tantamount to the absence from the classes.

§5

Forms of credits, exams

1. The acquired knowledge and skills will be assessed during the last day of classes. Assessment takes the form of a written test - max 60 single-choice/pseudosingle-choice questions.
2. Students, while taking a test, are not allowed to have any electronic devices which would enable them to communicate with other people at a distance.
3. The form of correction dates is determined by the number of students.

1. The Final test - students must get 60% of their answers correct in order to pass.
2. The student has the right to two correction assessments carried out in the form of a multiple-choice test. The test consists of 50 single-choice questions.
3. The following marking scheme was used:

 - 30-34 sufficient (3.0)
 - 35-38 satisfactory (3.5)
 - 39-42 good (4.0)
 - 43-46 very good (4.5)
 - 47-50 excellent (5.0)
